Administration has addressed two campus concerns that directly impact the education opportunities of our students. The rationale behind both disciplinary consequences are as follows:

Misconduct with a substitute teacher: The educational environment is already affected when the teacher is not in class. Therefore, it is imperative that the students are behavior in a positive and productive manner to minimize this change in their classroom environment. In addition, quality substitutes are highly needed to bridge the change in environment. Returning substitute teachers who are aware of our campus culture and environment help to minimize these changes to the classroom. Tardy after lunches: A continuous trend that administration noticed was the amount of tardies that occurred after lunches. This delays the impact on instruction and provides constant disruptions as student enter the room. Administration begins lunch release two minutes prior to the bell ringing to ensure students have enough time to exit the cafeteria and arrive to class on time. The necessity to get to class after lunch has been delivered and the amount of tardies after lunches has minimized tremendously.
