Class Rank is based on a cumulative grade point average for grades 9 – 12, plus high school courses taken in junior high and credits earned via correspondence. A student's GPA is calculated by dividing the total number of grade points by the number of semester courses attempted. Students are officially ranked for the first time after the fifth semester in high school.

A full year, one period course consisting of two semesters would be equivalent to one credit. One semester equals one-half credit.

ADVANCED PLACEMENT PROGRAM

The philosophy of Seven Lakes is that the AP program is open enrollment and all students enrolled in an Advanced Placement course are encouraged to take the corresponding AP exam.

In May 2016, students took 2,841 AP exams. Approximately 93% of test scores were 3 or better, which are scores typically necessary to receive college credit.
