

2020 Seven Lakes High School AP Exam Information

- FALL**
- REGISTRATION:** Registration begins on September 25, 2019 at 7:00 am and ends on October 25, 2019 at 11:59 pm. Students who are enrolled in an AP class during the fall semester **MUST** register to take AP exams by the deadline on October 25th. This includes Miller and KVS students as well as summer KVS students.
- SPRING**
- REGISTRATION:** Registration for spring semester only classes begins on January 15, 2020 at 7:00 am and ends on February 16, 2020 at 11:59 pm. Students who are enrolled in a spring semester only AP class **MUST** register to take exams by the deadline on February 16, 2020. This includes Miller and KVS students.
- LATE**
- REGISTRATION:** Students may not register for exams after the October 25th deadline until the designated late registration period. Late registration for full-year classes and fall semester only classes begins on January 15, 2020 at 7:00 am and ends on February 16, 2020 at 11:59 pm. Students who were enrolled in a full-year class or fall semester only AP class during the fall registration period may complete Late Registration during this time for a \$40 late fee per exam. All registrations will end on February 16, 2020 at 11:59 pm.
- COST:** **\$98 per AP Exam. \$148 for AP Capstone Exams (Research and Seminar).** This year, you may make partial payments of \$42 per exam plus a \$2.75 convenience fee per payment charged by Total Registration. Final payments must be made by March 1, 2020.
- FREE/REDUCED INFORMATION:** Students on the current SLHS Free/Reduced lunch list may apply for fee waivers during the exam registration process to reduce the cost of their exams. His/her registration will be put on hold in Total Registration until the request for a fee waiver is verified. The fee will be **\$25 per exam for Free/Reduced lunch registration. AP Capstone exam fee is \$75.00.** Students in special economic circumstances (Free and Reduced Lunch) **MUST** identify that need during the registration window. All requests for fee waivers must be made **during the registration period for the exams** to ensure proper arrangements are made for the student. **If you cancel your exam, you will be required to pay an additional \$15 to cover the minimum \$40 cost.**
- REFUNDS:** \$54 may be refunded to seniors who have been admitted to a college and who have documentation that the college will not accept their senior year AP exam scores for credit. Refunds must be requested in writing with the documentation attached to Ms. Norris in the Front Office by April 15, 2020 stating you no longer wish to take the exam and are requesting a partial refund. **Check with your college or university before you register.**
- EXAM SCHEDULE:** AP Exams are scheduled for the weeks of May 4th – 8th and May 11th – 15th. The campus will determine the most appropriate schedule to accommodate any exam conflicts. Alternate exams are administered May 20th – 22nd.
- ACCOMMODATIONS:** Students in need of testing accommodations must adhere to the College Board timeline for these requests. Requests must be submitted to the counselor no later than January 15, 2020. **Contact the student's counselor or AP coordinator with any questions.**

REGISTRATION INFORMATION:

- Register and pay for AP Exams online at www.TotalRegistration.net/AP/443727
- Make sure you have joined the class section on the College Board website prior to registering.
- Students who are taking an exam only and have not participated in an AP class either on campus, at Miller or through KVS, will need to get a Join Code from the AP Coordinator, Ms. Norris, in the front office prior to registration.
- Each student must use his/her own email address. Siblings may not share an email address. Important AP Exam information will be sent to the address provided.
- Answer all questions; Choose and mark the correct exam.
- Have your debit or credit card ready when you register.
- Registration is not complete until payment is made and the confirmation PDF is printed.
- No registrations will be accepted after the deadline.

NOTES:

- Students enrolled in AP classes are strongly encouraged but not required to participate in AP Exams. The exam has no bearing on your high school course grade.
- By state law, scores of 3, 4 or 5 on AP exams are accepted for credit at Texas public colleges and universities. Other institutions have their own policy on awarding college credit or advanced standing.
