PROGRAMS OF STUDY



Restaurant and Food/Beverage Services (i.e. Chef & Head Cook)

Perform a variety of tasks to maintain operations and promote guest services in eating and drinking establishments.

Lodging (i.e. Lodging Manager)

Perform tasks related to the operation of lodging facilities and the care of guests who use these facilities, either through direct guest contact or the provision of background services that enhance the guest experience.

Travel and Tourism (i.e. Travel & Tourism Director)

Focus on the development, research, packaging, promotion and delivery of a traveler's experiences.

Recreation, Amusements and Attractions (i.e. Recreation Worker)

Good customer service skills are essential for success. Employees must also understand what makes each operation unique. Technical skills are location-specific, and training is handled on the job.
