Statement of Purpose

Evaluation

Faldyn Elementary will collaborate with parents to evaluate the effectiveness of the Title I program and parental engagement level. Parent and teacher surveys will be used to collect data which will aid in designing strategies for more effective parental engagement. Information from needs assessments, classroom observations, test data and other resources will be analyzed and used to revise the Title I program to meet current and future needs of the school. Modifications and ways to improve our practices will be reviewed and reported. Additionally, a family questionnaire will be distributed at the end of each school year to conduct an annual evaluation of the Title I program.

Developing the Procedures

The parental engagement procedures are a collaborative effort of faculty, staff, administration and parents. The campus advisory team (CAT) reflects the diversity of the student population, and meetings are scheduled at a time and place convenient to all of its members. The procedures are reviewed annually and modified as needed to address current concerns and the needs of students, parents, the community and the school.

School-Parent Compact




