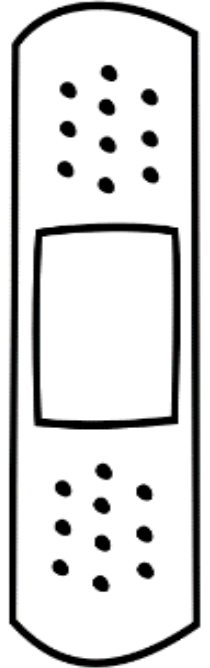
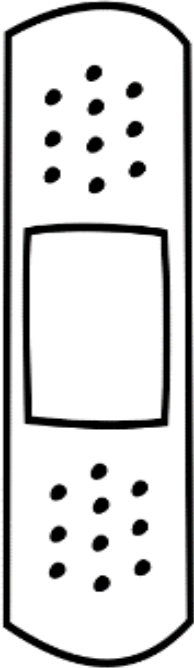


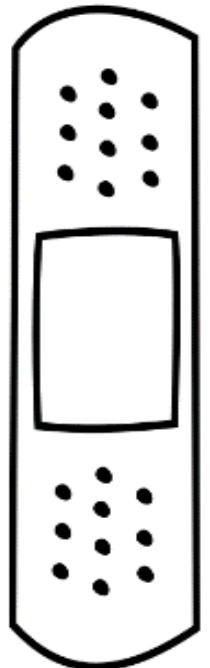
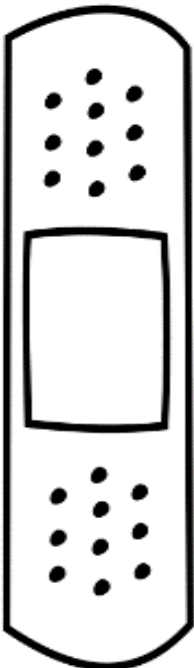
Nurse's Notes



The clinic at Miller Career & Technology Center follows the same guidelines as the home campus clinics. Please be sure the nurses at **both** your home campus and Miller Career & Technology Center are aware of any health conditions or medications.

24 Hour Rule

Students who demonstrate signs and symptoms of illness or a possible communicable disease should be referred to the school clinic for further assessment. Those with an elevated temperature of 100 degrees or above or those who vomit or have diarrhea must be isolated and sent home. The student must be fever free without fever-reducing medication for 24 hours before he/she can be allowed back in school. Those excluded due to vomiting or diarrhea must also be free of symptoms without the use of preventative medications before being allowed back in school.



Medications

Per district policy, the nurse is unable to give your child any medications except those which have been provided from home. All medications brought to school must have a completed authorization form before your child is able to receive the medications. Please contact the nurse for the appropriate form.

Diabetics, Epileptics, Asthmatics and Students with Allergies or Cardiac Conditions

If your child has any of these conditions or any other life altering medical condition, please let **both** your home campus and the Miller campus nurse know. In order to provide the very best care for your child and to ensure your child's safety on campus, we will create an Individual Healthcare Plan with the guidance of your doctor. A plan of care will help us to know what needs your child has and how to meet those needs. Care plans are updated yearly at the beginning of the school year, so if you are aware that your child will need an updated care plan please contact the nurse for the necessary paperwork.
