

## 2020-2021 HCC Classes at THS (Eng 1301, Gov 2305, Eco 2301)

- HCC start date is August 31, 2020
- All students who have elected to attend school face to face must report to THS for all HCC courses, every day, beginning September 8<sup>th</sup>, as those students have been assigned to an HCC study hall with a THS teacher. KVA students will complete their HCC coursework at home during the normally scheduled class period.
- Face to face students are responsible for logging in to their HCC study hall teacher's Canvas page and taking the attendance quiz every day.
- How to sign into HCC for the first time? See attached handout.
- Technology? Students are strongly encouraged to bring their own device to complete their coursework while on campus. If students do not have their own device, they should sign up to check out a district device (Chromebook). Students must bring their own earbuds/headphones. The **Economics program** has changed the textbook used for dual credit classes in the Fall 2020. The new package will include the Open Education Resources textbook from Openstax: Principles of Macroeconomics, and a homework supplement package Edfinity.

The textbook is free and accessible on the internet and is also embedded in the Canvas courses and it will be accessible to students on day one. The Edfinity package will provide additional homework and exams for a cost of about \$20/student/semester and will be required. Students can purchase directly online through Canvas for about \$20 or go through the bookstore. The textbook will be available on day one to students and the purchase of the homework package should be easy and quick, avoiding delays for students. Instructions will be provided to students regarding the purchase of the Edfinity package inside the Canvas course and in the syllabus.
