Benefits of Dual Credit



What's the difference?

Curriculum designed by HCC, Course may be taught by a Katy ISD teacher or HCC professor	Curriculum designed by College Board, Course taught by a Katy ISD teacher

DC Science Courses

SUBJECT: DUAL CREDIT SCIENCE COURSES

Katy ISD is expanding the dual credit science courses offered to high school students. Science courses must include a lab component to meet the TEKS requirement for graduation. Because of the lab requirement, campuses should consider the following:

- Campuses with embedded Dual Credit Biology and Dual Credit Anatomy and Physiology teachers will provide the required lab component embedded within the course. This will allow the courses to count as an advanced science credit on a student's transcript.
- Students who attend campuses without an embedded teacher for these courses will have
 the option to take the lab at the HCC Katy campus. Students will need to show their
 transcript proving they attained a passing grade in the lab to the campus registrar to receive
 advanced science credit. If the labs are not taken at the HCC campus, students will receive
 elective credit on their transcript for the courses.
- Dual Credit Chemistry is designed for students in the Young Educators Program; however, other students who are not in the program are welcome to take the course to earn college credit. Dual Credit Chemistry is a semester course. Students who choose to take this course will receive elective credit. Students who want a full year advanced science course need to select another offering. There should be no students enrolled in this course for the 2024-2025 school year as the prerequisites for this course have not yet been met since this is a new program.

UIL Eligibility

 Dual Credit courses in English, LOTE, Math, Science, and Social Studies are exempt from No Pass No Play rules

Attendance

- HCC does not differentiate between excused and unexcused absences

- Student can be dropped for 6+ absences
- Student is responsible for all make-up work
- Specific meeting days/times may vary by course/campus


