On Wednesday, March 6, 2024, juniors will take the digital SAT School Day at their home campus and are automatically registered for this exam.

Katy ISD provides all students with academic opportunities needed to prepare them for college and beyond. Participation in the SAT School Day is an important step in preparing for college.

The SAT is accepted by all U.S. colleges; it measures what students are learning in high school and what they need to know to succeed in college and career. With SAT School Day, all students have access to this important stepping-stone. Students can choose which colleges, universities, and / or scholarship programs to send their four free score reports.

Students can prepare for this exam by reviewing the information in the <u>SAT School Day Student Guide</u>. They can also sign up for free practice on Khan Academy. What Should Students Do Before Test Day?

- Create a College Board Account
- Decide where to send scores

What Should Students Bring on Test Day?

- A pen or pencil for scratch work (No. 2 pencil not required)
- Current and valid school/government issued ID
- Snacks/drinks to be consumed during breaks
- Desmos Calculator is embedded in the Bluebook app; however, a student can also choose to bring a College Board approved calculator. If a student needs a hand-held calculator, please contact the Campus Testing Coordinator.
- List of 4 colleges/scholarships to send scores
- Email address/mobile number (optional)

Score Reports will only be available electronically to students through BigFuture School and in the student's personal College Board account.
