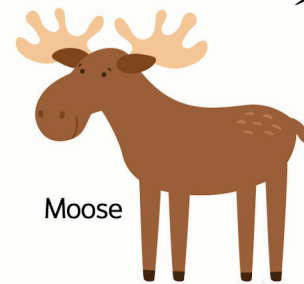

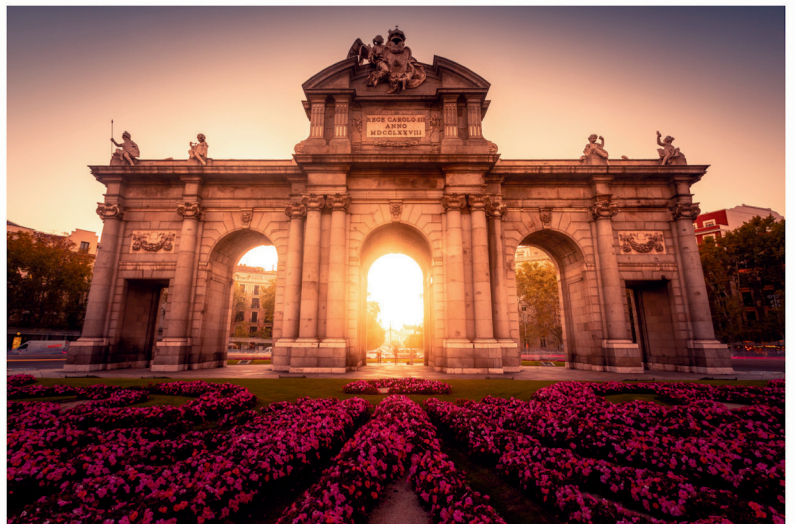

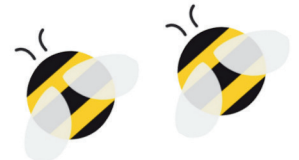
There are so many things you can do to conserve water. If you haven't already, look up some ways and try a few!

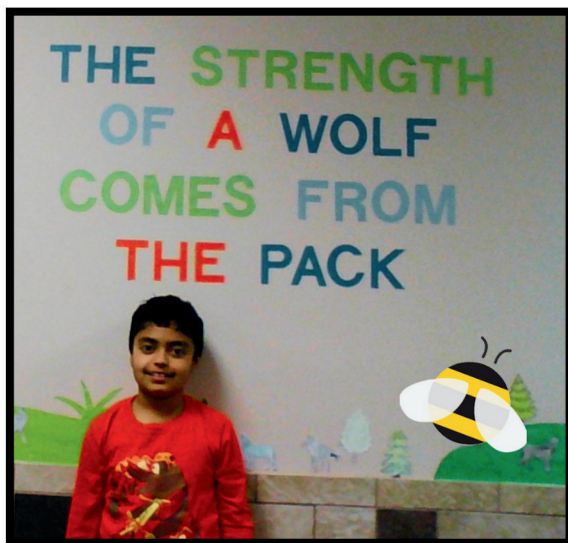


# Smart As Can Bee

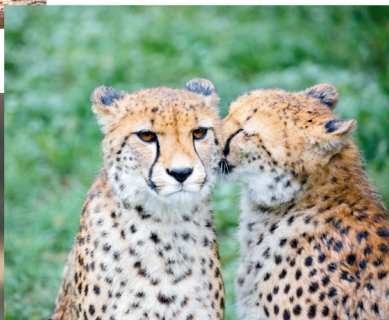


# Cheetahs

## Life as a Baby Cheetah

First, a cub is born from a mother. As you grow older your eyesight will get better because when you are born a baby cheetah it is blind and helpless. They weigh 8.5 to 15 ounces. When a cub is four to six months old a cub will start to learn to hunt. A cub will pounce on their siblings. They do that to play with each other. When they grow up all that pouncing on their siblings and sometimes their mother too will help when they are trying to find food. A baby cheetah will leave its mother when it is about 18 months old. After a cheetah leaves its mother and goes to live on its own, they will find a cave or a hill to live in. When a cheetah finds a place to stay it will rub their cheek or body around a tree or put its hind legs on the place it marked its territory. When a cheetah is about 20 to 24 months old it will have a litter between two to six cubs. When a mother cheetah is going to have cubs it will be about 93 days until it will have its cubs. Most cheetahs die when they are 10 to 12 years old. A cheetah is a fascinating creature but they are vulnerable which means they have a high chance of being extinct. Which means there will be no more cheetahs in the wild! I love cheetahs and I hope you will too.

# Astronomy

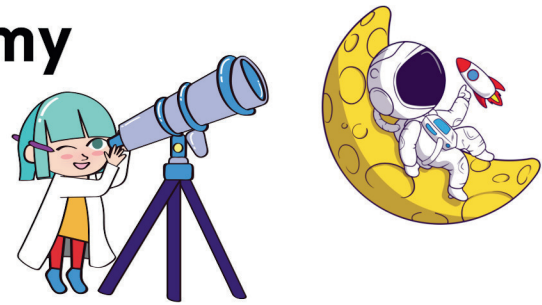
Astronomy is the study of space. Space is a very important part of science because astronomy tells us more about our world and the entire universe. Without astronomy, we would still believe that the universe revolves around Earth. Let's get right to it! Scientists predict that a special event is going to take place on April 8, 2024. Can you guess what it is? If you guessed solar eclipse you would be accurate! The solar eclipse will be visible to Texas, Mexico, and 14 other states before exiting to Mexico. There will also be a Quadrantid meteor shower January 3-4, and the next one won't occur until April! Sadly though the only states in the US that will see it will be California and Nevada.

Astronomy is the branch of science concerned with celestial objects, space, and the physical universe as a whole. Astronomers study the sun, moon, stars, planets, comets, and other heavenly bodies, including their characteristics and how they move. They also study galaxies and solar systems, asteroids and meteors, and interstellar matter like gasses and dust particles between stars.

Astrophysics (which applies the laws and theories of physics to the interpretation of astronomical observations) and cosmology (the science of the origin and development of the universe) are different branches of astronomy.

Astronomy as a field of science is primarily observational rather than experimental since astronomers must rely on what they can observe through high-powered telescopes or small rock and soil samples brought back by astronauts. But while astronomers focus their eyes upward, the application of astronomy has made a significant impact on Earth, allowing for the development of navigation and calendars, as well as philosophical-religious pondering on the nature of the universe and humankind's place in it.

Our planet, Earth, orbits a single star. But imagine orbiting two stars. Scientists tell us that two or more stars in a star system are common. Multiple star systems don't stop at two. If you make a wish on the North Star you should really get three wishes because there are three stars. That's why the North Star is so bright.

Space is completely silent so even if you scream as loud as you can no one would hear you.

The hottest planet in our solar system is 450 degrees Celsius.

You may think that Mercury is the hottest planet, but that would not be accurate. Since Mercury doesn't have a strong atmosphere, heat escapes easily.

Unlike Mercury, Venus has the strongest atmosphere out of all the planets which allows Venus's atmosphere to trap all the heat.

In 3.75 billion years the Milky Way and Andromeda galaxies will collide.

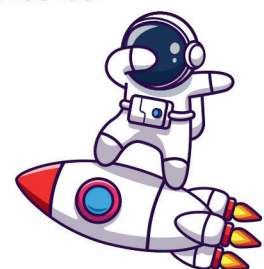
Mercury and Venus are the only planets in the solar system without a single moon. This is because of their close distance to the sun.
