

Students who do not meet these requirements must either attend summer school or repeat your current grade.



## Three Class Format:

Academic - For everyone, on grade level, more time to review concepts, prepares students for college as well as other postsecondary education

KAP – More challenging, fast paced, prepares students for AP classes in high school \*We recommend students have an "A" average in an Academic class

GT - Must be currently screened and identified

- \*Standardized test scores

- \*How quickly you catch on to new material

## KAP PROGRAM INFORMATION



EXIT,

- Although we highly encourage students to stay in a KAP class, they may exit a course during the first 6weeks grading period or at the end of the 1<sup>st</sup> semester.
- The student must have teacher and parent approval to exit.
- If the student's 6-weeks average falls below 70, the student will be placed into an Academic class at the end of the grading period unless otherwise recommended by the teacher.

The KAP Course Commitment form is included on the back of the course selection sheet.

## Math for 7<sup>th</sup> Graders

6th, 7th, and 8th grade math classes are the foundations for high school math classes and should not be rushed.

#### Academic Math - on grade level curriculum

- Students will have math homework weekly to practice the concepts
- Students will learn 7th grade math skills/concepts only

KAP Math - accelerated math class covering the remaining 1/2 of 7th grade and all of 8th grade math curriculum

- \* A new concept is learned almost every day
- Students will have math homework every night to practice the concepts
- \* KAP math focuses on preparing students for High School Algebra 1 in 8th grade
- \* 7th grade KAP Math Students will take the 8th grade STAAR
- \* Current high achieving students in 6<sup>th</sup> grade KAP Math can take a Credit By Exam (CBE) for 8<sup>th</sup> grade Math this summer (June/July testing windows). Students who pass the 8<sup>th</sup> grade Math CBE will be eligible to take Algebra in the 7<sup>th</sup> grade.
- \* 6<sup>th</sup> Graders currently in ACA Math can choose to take 7<sup>th</sup> Grade KAP Math in 7<sup>th</sup> Grade. It is highly recommended to attend Math Bridge Program over the summer to teach missed concepts from 6<sup>th</sup> Grade KAP Math. (more details coming closer to summer)

## Math for 8th Graders

6th, 7th, and 8th grade math classes are the foundations for high school math classes and should not be rushed.

- \* Academic Math on grade level curriculum
  - Students will have math homework weekly to practice the concepts
  - Students will learn 8th grade math skills/concepts only
- \* Algebra 1 High School credit math class covering Algebra 1 curriculum
  - \* A new concept is learned almost every day
  - \* Students will have math homework every night to practice the concepts
  - Students will receive HS credit upon completion of the course
  - \* 8th grade Algebra 1 students will take the Algebra 1 EOC
  - \* Current high achieving students in 7<sup>th</sup> grade Aca Math can take a Credit By Exam (CBE) for 8<sup>th</sup> grade Math this summer (June/July testing windows). Students who pass the 8<sup>th</sup> grade Math CBE will be eligible to take Algebra in the 8<sup>th</sup> grade.

## KAP Math for 6th-8th Grade

KAP is the compacting of the junior high curriculum from 3 years to 2 years so that your child would be able to take Algebra I (a high school credit class) by  $8^{th}$  grade.

By taking your first high school math class in junior high, this frees up your child's senior year, to choose to take AP calculus, AP statistics, or other dual credit college credit math classes.

## ELA-R, Science, and Social Studies

- The difference in academic and KAP for English Language Arts & Reading (ELA-R), Science, and Social Studies comes in the resources/materials used and performance expectations.
- \*KAP is built upon the core academic curriculum and is designed to build student capacity to understand more rigorous content.
- \*KAP is designed to help prepare students for advanced courses in high school.
- \*KAP/ACA ELA-R classes are blocked in 7<sup>th</sup> grade (meaning it is 2 class periods in a row with the same teacher). 7<sup>th</sup> grade GT ELA-R and 8<sup>th</sup> grade

  KAP/GT/ACA ELA-R classes are only 1 class period long.

## Possible Required Courses

These courses take the place of your elective class.

- \* Math Lab: designed to help refine math concepts and fill in gaps
- \*Strategic Reading: designed to help improve reading proficiency and comprehension

Placement may be mandatory as a result of KISD standards and graduation requirements.

STAAR results are used to determine placement in the above courses.

## **Electives**

- \* 7th grade students will receive 1 elective for the year
- \* 7th grade GT ELA-R students will receive 2 electives for the year as the GT ELA-R course is only one class period long
- \* 8th grade students will receive 2 electives for the year
- \* Please be aware that some electives require after school commitments.
- \* Electives have assignments & receive numeric grades.
- Due to the high demand of certain electives, <u>placement in elective</u> courses will be limited based on availability and is not guaranteed.

## Theatre 2 & Theatre 3


- This class is for students who have successfully completed Theatre 1 and are interested in increasing their theatre skills. Further emphasis on acting skills, history of theatre, technical, and design work are explored.
- Students who are interested in furthering their acting or technical skills in front of a larger audience are encouraged to audition for the annual spring show, and to volunteer as ushers for our productions.

## Theatre 2/3 Production

# Student Aide – 8th Grade Only

### Must be approved by Administrator/Counselor

- Applications must be completed by March 10<sup>th</sup> via the google doc
- Incoming 8th grade students (current 7<sup>th</sup> graders) can apply to be a student aide as one of their elective choices. Students will be selected based on their application and teacher recommendations.
- Students who are selected as aides are helpful, respectful, and trustworthy. They must have good attendance and be passing all their classes. The student aides need to be positive representatives of our school. They must always behave appropriately and follow the student dress code.
- Student aides must be friendly, welcoming, and respect the confidentiality of our office.
- Student aides must be passing all classes and not have any N's or U's in conduct.
- Students are not eligible if they have been assigned I.S.S., been suspended from school, or received an attendance referral for excessive absences during the current school year.

# High School Credit Electives



## HIGH SCHOOL CREDIT COURSES



- If you take a high school credit course in 7<sup>th</sup> or 8<sup>th</sup> grade, you MUST NOT request the same course in high school.
- You CANNOT repeat a course for which you have already earned credit.
- No credit is awarded for a duplicated course.
- Please make sure to choose HS credit classes carefully as once a grade is on their transcript it cannot be removed. Students enrolled in a HS credit course who are making below an 80% should seriously consider dropping the course to avoid any negative affects to their GPA in high school. You will not be able to drop after the 1st grading period.
- If the student does not pass the 1st or 2nd grading period or fails the 1st semester, he/she will automatically be dropped from the course per district policy.
- Regardless of the grade, no students will be removed from a HS credit course after the 1st semester.

All semester grades and grade points earned in high school credit courses become a permanent part of the student's high school transcript and are factored into the student's grade point average and class rank.





#### Init 3 (a) How Do I Get In?

Admission to college can be competitive. If students create a plan to maximize their high school years, they increase their options for education beyond high school. There is no single path to college admission, but a well-thought-out plan will help students ensure that they have used their high school opportunities to maximum benefit.

The vocabulary of the college application process can be daunting. Students encounter the idea of GPA and transcripts, along with national standardized tests such as SAT and ACT. Extracurricular activities, both in and out of school, provide valuable learning and service opportunities for students. However, students need to remember to track their activities and awards in preparation for applying for both financial aid and admission.

States and local school districts set requirements for high school graduation, but many colleges require course work beyond basic requirements. These requirements can change from year to year. School curselors are a vital source of information about current craduation requirements.

#### esson Overview

Students will complete a graphic organizer during an interactive presentation about the factors that colleges consider during the admission process. Following the presentation, students will outline individual action items that will improve the likelihood of success in the college process. Instructors can extend the lesson by assigning students an admission essay.


