# What is Dual Credit?

Dual Credit is a process by which a
high school student enrolls in a
college course and receives academic
or workforce credit for the course
from both the college and the high
school at the same time.

# What's the difference?

Dual Credit	Advanced Placement (AP)
Curriculum designed by HCC, Course may be taught by a Katy ISD teacher or HCC professor	Curriculum designed by College Board, Course taught by a Katy ISD teacher
College credit dependent upon a passing grade in the course	College credit depending upon passing the AP exam*
GPA on 4.5 scale	GPA on 5.0 scale
Generally transferable to colleges/universities in Texas	Credit policy varies by college/university  AP Credit Policy

# Dual Credit Core Courses

Are taught by college faculty or college-approved high school instructors meeting the same standards and requirements of regularly employed college faculty.

Meet Texas Common Core requirements and are transferable to any public college or university in the state of Texas.

# **FERPA**

FERPA is a federal law that governs privacy of and access to personally identifiable student records. Instructors will only communicate with the student about their grade status and not the parent. Parents should communicate with their student about academic progress.

Students must communicate with the instructor

College Faculty will <u>NOT</u> communicate with parents about the college grade

If a parent has a concern, they can reach out to their high school administration who will facilitate communication with the college

# Student Expectations



In all matters related to the dual credit course, students are held to the standards, expectations and regulations of HCC.

- 1. Academic standards
- 2. Attendance requirements
- 3. Grading procedures
- 4. Discipline procedures (including appeals)

# Attendance Requirements

- 1. HCC does not differentiate between unexcused and excused absences.
- 2. KISD field trips count as absences.
- 3. Student can be dropped for excessive absences (more than 6).
- 4. Student is responsible for make-up work.
- 5. Classes meet 2-3 days per week if taught by HCC faculty and 5 days per week if taught by a KISD teacher serving as embedded HCC faculty.

# **Grading Policies**

- Progress reports and report card grades are NOT issued during the semester.
- Instructors will ONLY communicate with the student (not the parent/guardian) about his/her course grades.
- Dual credit courses are exempt from UIL eligibility rules.
- Dual credit courses receive a weighted grade point of 4.5 for determining high school GPA.
- KISD final exam exemptions are not available for HCC dual credit courses.

# Discipline Policies

KISD disciplinary infractions may impact dual credit attendance.

Students may be administratively withdrawn for inappropriate behavior and attendance.

# Scholastic Dishonesty

# Includes but is not limited to cheating on a test, plagiarism, and collusion on an assignment.

- Possible consequences may include:
  - Receiving a grade of "0" or "F" on the assignment.
  - Failure in the course and/or recommendation for probation or dismissal from HCC.
- 30-day appeal window
- Katy ISD will honor the decision of the HCC appeals committee.

# Participation Requirements 2025 - 2026



- ✓ Meet KISD prerequisites, including grade level
- ✓ Meet HCC course specific requirements
- Complete admission and enrollment process
- ✓ Purchase textbooks for the course
- Pay associated fees-\$65 per course, per semester (approved classes only)



- Only courses HCC & KISD have approves can be taken as dual credit courses
- If students register for unapproved courses, they will not receive KISD credit and must pay full price
- Courses Offered
- Not all courses offered in KISD are available at JHS
- Campus offerings are based on
  - Enrollment size
  - Teacher qualifications
  - Master schedule

- Step 1: Fill out the Dual Credit Form and ensure you have met the requirements to take the course.
- Step 2: Scores, if needed.
- Step 3: When we return to school -HCC will enroll students based on the high school roster as we return to school.

  - students who do not go "undecided" –
     will need to meet scores
  - Students who select "undecided" do
     NOT need to meet scores

- Step 3: HCC will enroll students based on the high school roster as we return to school.

- Follow all directions on guide as you apply
  - Highly encourage to NOT use an icloud email
- Required for new HCC students only.
  - Students who are returning DO NOT have to re-apply to HCC because they are already HCC students.
- Reminder: Must choose Undecided as major to be considered Non-Degree Seeking
- Typically takes 24-48 hours after applying for students to get acceptance email from HCC
  - Need acceptance email to set up MyEagle account and to get HCC ID#
  - Do NOT delete this email!

# **Updated Eligibility Criteria for Dual Credit Students**

Under the revised policy, students participating in dual credit programs may qualify for enrollment as follows:

#### • 1. TSI Exemption

• Achieve passing scores on ACT, SAT, or TSI-related AP exams

#### • 2. TSIA Testing

Pass the TSIA test in the relevant subject area

#### • 3. TSI Waiver

• Enroll in a Level 1 certificate program to qualify for a waiver

#### • 4. Non-Degree Seeking Classification \

- Students may be classified as Non-Degree Seeking under the following conditions:
- They may enroll in academic courses for 14 college-level credit hours
- To continue beyond the 14-hour limit, students must meet TSI requirements through testing or course completion (3 hours in math and/or 3 hours in English)
- They must satisfy the course prerequisites, excluding college readiness requirements
- The ISD or high school can determine and assess whether students meet the necessary college readiness standards. HCC staff are not permitted to participate in this process

# Non-Degree Seeking Student Classification

#### The THECB has provided the following clarifications:

- A Non-Degree Seeking Student is defined as one who has not filed a degree plan with an institution of higher education (Texas Education Code §51.9685)
- High school students classified as Non-Degree Seeking are not required to be TSI-met (college-ready) to enroll in dual credit courses
- Institutions are prohibited from requiring Non-Degree Seeking high school students to meet college-ready standards
- This adjustment applies **only** to dual credit students enrolling in academic courses. Workforce students will continue under the current Level 1 certificate degree plan process without changes to their TSI status.



- I understand that once the student is registered in a college course, he/she controls access to his or her educational records under the
  Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) and—unless an exception applies—I may not have access to my student's records
  without his/her written permission or proof that I claimed the student as a dependent on my most recent income tax return.
- I understand that a college level standard of conduct is required. It is my responsibility to comply with the admission policies, student code of conduct, policies, academic standards of HCC, and standards set forth in the course syllabus.
- I acknowledge that I have read the Student Commitment Statement and understand that I can only succeed through hard work and will take the initiative in my education.
- I understand that Out-Of-district fees are assessed based on a student's home address. Students may be required to pay the fee, or the school district may assume responsibility.

# TYPICAL ISSUES

- 1. Students only complete the Student Profile portion of Apply Texas and does not complete the entire application.
- 2. Student applies to the college they plan to attend instead of HCC.
- 3. Did not select "dual credit" in the application
- 4. Student selects the wrong term. (Spring instead of Fall).
- 5. Student chooses the wrong major and then is required to qualify through testing.
- Student does not complete the paperwork correctly
