Credit Policies

Academic credit is transferable to public colleges/universities in Texas either as core or elective credit

May or may not be accepted by out-of-state or private institutions

Students are responsible for determining whether their college will accept credit in transfer







- Lunderstand that once the student is registered in a college course, he/she controls access to his or her educational records under the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) and — unless an exception applies—I may not have access to my student's records without his/her written permission or proof that I claimed the student as a dependent on my most recent income tax return.
- I understand that a college level standard of conduct is required. It is my responsibility to comply with the admission policies, student
 code of conduct, policies, academic standards of HCC, and standards set forth in the course syllabus.

Important Updates

Students *new* to Dual Credit will need to submit two things to HCC:

- Waiver form -The waiver allows HCC to apply a DC tuition waiver to the students' account.
- The Residency form This form allows HCC to edit student information in the event it was entered incorrectly in ApplyTexas

Returning students do not need to submit anything EXCEPT the CAMPUS' ONLINE REGISTRATION



Optional Forms

FERPA Release: Easier to submit it online since it has to be taken to HCC. <u>https://formsportal.hccs.edu/Forms/FERPA</u>

Bacterial Meningitis: Required for students who attend a class at HCC. Vaccine information may be submitted to the email address on the form, or students may complete the waiver linked on the form if they choose not to get the vaccine.

Government Online Requirement

State law requires that dual credit courses offered in partnership with an institute of higher education must cover the Texas Essential Knowledge and Skills (TEKS). The dual credit US Government course offered by HCC does not include TEKS on state and local government. In order for students to receive high school credit for the dual credit government course students must also complete an online component in Canvas on state and local government.

- This online component is completed on a pass/fail basis.
- Campuses can require that students complete the Canvas online course:
 - o In the opening days of the Katy ISD semester prior to the start of HCC classes,
 - o During the course of the semester, or
 - After the completion of the HCC semester but before the end of the Katy ISD semester.

Students who take dual credit US Government in summer school must also document completion before receiving high school credit for the course. High School Social Studies Instructional Coaches have been provided with training on the management of the Canvas course.

THE PLACEMENT TESTS

TSI ELAR Test

- There are 30-78 questions on this test.
- Subject matter includes:
 - Literary Text Analysis, Informational Text Analysis and Synthesis items, Essay Revision and Editing, Sentence Revision, Editing, and Completion items.

TSI Writing Test

• A 300-600 word essay.

TSI Math Test

- There are 20-68 multiple-choice questions on this test.
- Subject matter includes:
 - Quantitative Reasoning, Algebraic Reasoning, Geometric and Spatial Reasoning and Probabilistic and Statistical Reasoning.

Student Registration

ApplyTexas Application

- applytexas.org
- Typically takes 24-48 hours for students to get HCC information after applying
- Students who are returning DO NOT have to apply using ApplyTexas again. They already have their needed information.
- □ Required for new HCC students only.
- Reminder: If student is enrolling in a summer DCC course, they do not need to complete a separate ApplyTexas application.



Typical Issues

- 1. Students does not fully apply.
- 2. Student applies to the college they plan to attend instead of HCC.
- 3. Student selects the wrong term. (Spring instead of fall)

Absences

HCC does not differentiate between unexcused and excused absences.

- 1. KISD field trips count as absences.
- 2. Student can be dropped for excessive absences (more than 6).
- 3. Student is responsible for make-up work.
- 4. Specific Meetings times and days vary by campus.


There are no final exam exemptions for dual credit. All students must take the final.

- When dropping a course and entering a new course, the grade will depend on the timing of the drop






Are You Eligible?


