Credit Policies

Academic credit is transferable to public colleges/universities in Texas either as core or elective credit

May or may not be accepted by out-of-state or private institutions

Students are responsible for determining whether their college will accept credit in transfer

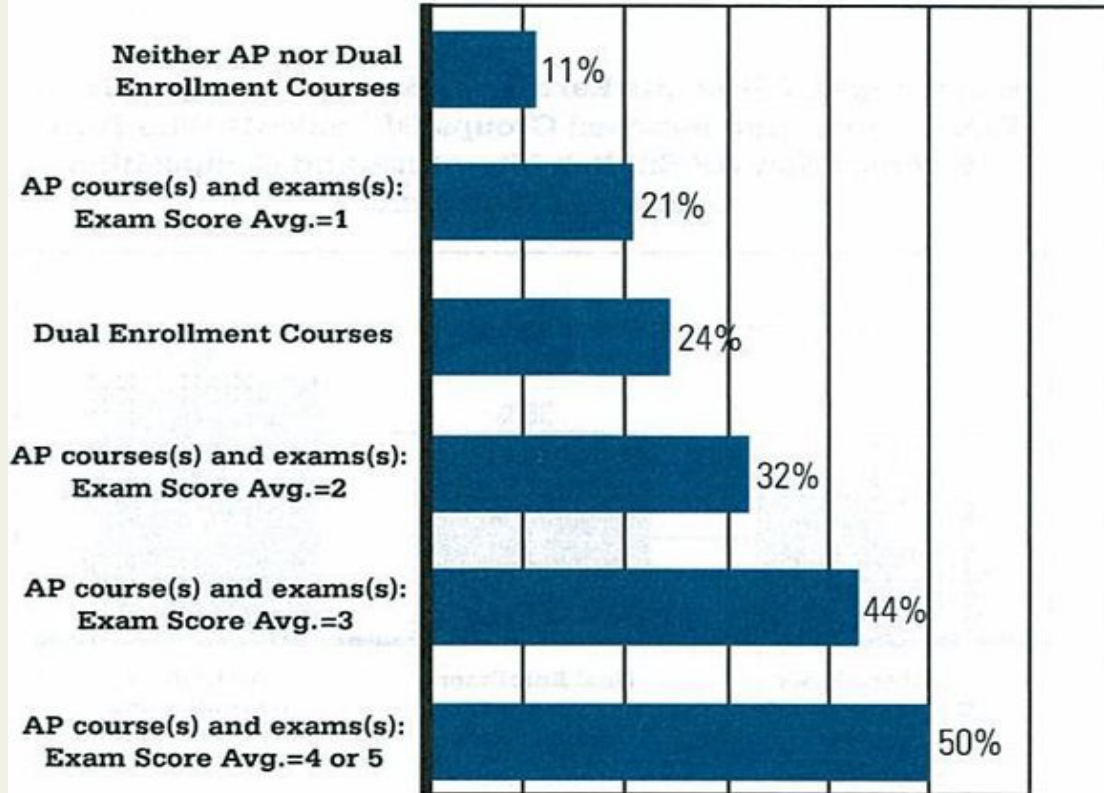

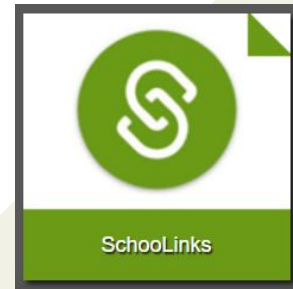
Course Selection

- I understand that once the student is registered in a college course, he/she controls access to his or her educational records under the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) and—unless an exception applies—I may not have access to my student's records without his/her written permission or proof that I claimed the student as a dependent on my most recent income tax return.
- I understand that a college level standard of conduct is required. It is my responsibility to comply with the admission policies, student code of conduct, policies, academic standards of HCC, and standards set forth in the course syllabus.

Important Updates

Students *new* to Dual Credit will need to submit two things to HCC:

- Waiver form -The waiver allows HCC to apply a DC tuition waiver to the students' account.
- The Residency form - This form allows HCC to edit student information in the event it was entered incorrectly in ApplyTexas

Students returning to Dual credit **ONLY** submit **CAMPUS ONLINE REGISTRATION** form.

Steps to apply for dual credit:

1. Choose the dual credit course as part of your schedule when completing course selection in SchoolLinks
2. Complete your ApplyTexas college application by March 1st
 - a. www.ApplyTexas.org
 - b. Use your personal email (not school or iCloud)
 - c. Complete both the profile AND the application sections choosing dual credit as your application type
3. Watch for email from HCC with student ID
 - a. Starts with a "w"
 - b. Needed for KISD application
4. Complete the KISD HCC Dual Credit application
 - a. Packet is on the OTHS counselors website www.katyisd.org/domain/1893
5. Submit completed through the portal
 - a. on the OTHS counselors website www.katyisd.org/domain/1893
6. Save your confirmation email.
 - a. You should receive it within a few hours.
 - b. Once your application is reviewed, you will be contacted if:
 - i. We find any mistakes or missing information
 - ii. You do not meet eligibility requirements and need to take the TSI (more info in a minute)

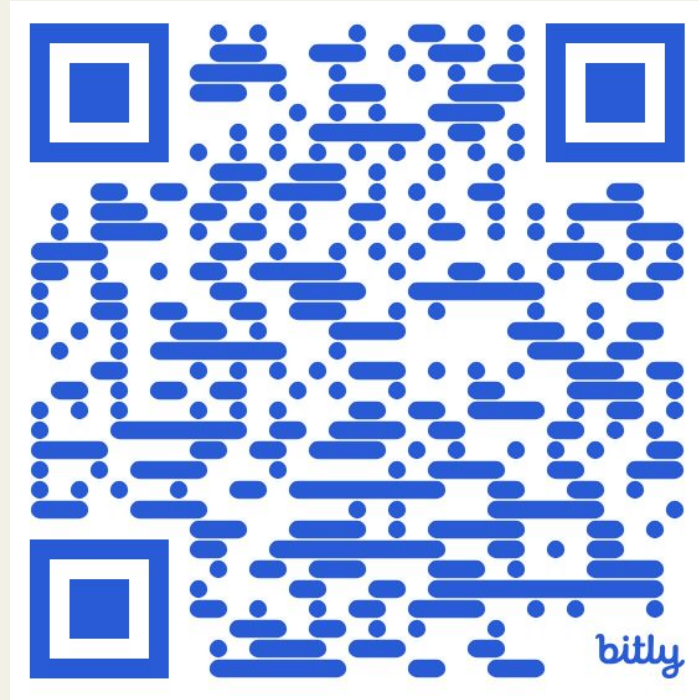

UIL Eligibility

For High School Students there are courses that are exempt from the rule below.

The following courses are eligible for exemption for extracurricular activity participation:

- Dual Credit courses in English, LOTE, Math, Science, and Social Studies only.

Government Online Requirement

State law requires that dual credit courses offered in partnership with an institute of higher education must cover the Texas Essential Knowledge and Skills (TEKS). The dual credit US Government course offered by HCC does not include TEKS on state and local government. In order for students to receive high school credit for the dual credit government course students must also complete an online component in Canvas on state and local government.

- This online component is completed on a pass/fail basis.
- Campuses can require that students complete the Canvas online course:
 - In the opening days of the Katy ISD semester prior to the start of HCC classes,
 - During the course of the semester, or
 - After the completion of the HCC semester but before the end of the Katy ISD semester.

Students who take dual credit US Government in summer school must also document completion before receiving high school credit for the course. High School Social Studies Instructional Coaches have been provided with training on the management of the Canvas course.

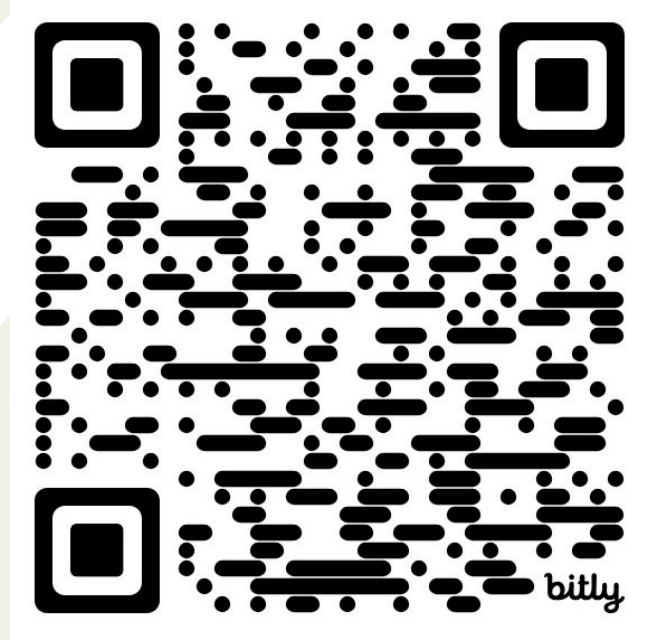

TSI ELAR Test

- There are 30-78 questions on this test.
- Subject matter includes:
 - Literary Text Analysis, Informational Text Analysis and Synthesis items, Essay Revision and Editing, Sentence Revision, Editing, and Completion items.

TSI Writing Test

- A 300-600 word essay.

TSI Math Test

- There are 20-68 multiple-choice questions on this test.
- Subject matter includes:
 - Quantitative Reasoning, Algebraic Reasoning, Geometric and Spatial Reasoning and Probabilistic and Statistical Reasoning.

Student Registration

ApplyTexas Application

- ❑ applytexas.org
- ❑ Typically takes 24-48 hours for students to get HCC information after applying
- ❑ Students who are returning DO NOT have to apply using ApplyTexas again. They already have their needed information.
- ❑ Required for new HCC students only.
- ❑ Reminder: If student is enrolling in a summer DCC course, they do not need to complete a separate ApplyTexas application.

Typical Issues

1. Students does not fully apply.
2. Student applies to the college they plan to attend instead of HCC.
3. Student selects the wrong term. (Spring instead of fall)

Payment Deadlines

Summer I: June 15, 2024

Summer II: July 15, 2024

Fall 2024: October 1, 2024*

***Payment may not be available on the MyEagle account until September 2024.**



HCC Policies

Bacterial Meningitis

Future and returning students who are under the age of 22 and plan to enroll in one of the course options below will be required to provide proof of meningitis or qualifying exemptions prior to enrollment.

Vaccination

- In-person
- Hybrid
- Hybrid Lab

Students enrolled in one of the following [course options](#) will automatically be exempt from the meningitis vaccination requirement.

- Online anytime
- Online on a schedule
- Dual-credit students attending a high school location

FERPA

FERPA affords students in “attendance” at Houston Community College certain rights with respect to their education records.

Absences

HCC does not differentiate between unexcused and excused absences.

1. KISD field trips count as absences.
2. Student can be dropped for excessive absences (more than 6).
3. Student is responsible for make-up work.
4. Specific Meetings times and days vary by campus.

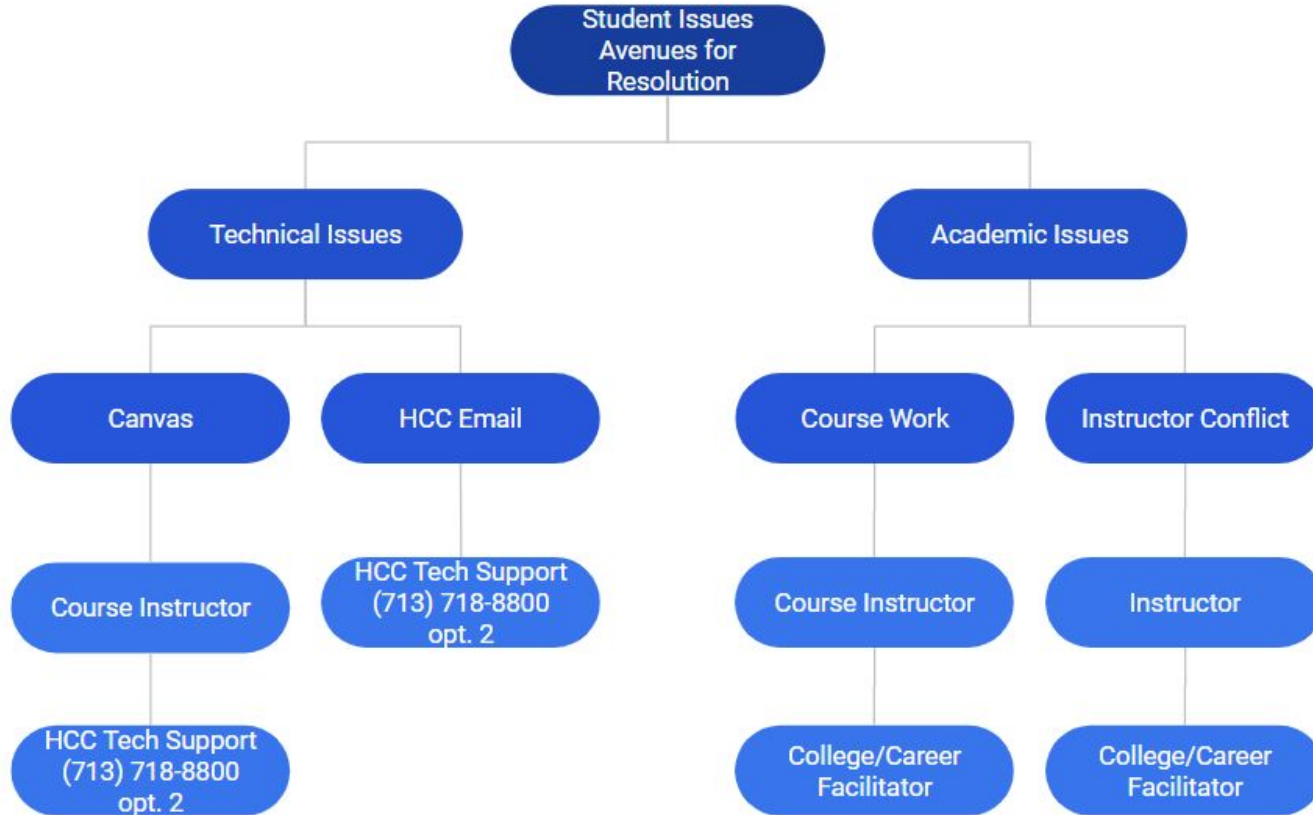
