## Differences between Elementary \& Junior High MORE FREEDOM!!

- School starts @ 8:55 AM
- School ends @ 4:05 PM
- $6^{\text {th }}$ grade Classes are all on the $1^{\text {st }}$ floor
- 7 classes plus lunch and advisory
- All students have advisory to allow time to do homework, study, organize work, Character Strong (community building/character lessons)
- 45 minute class periods \& 5 minute passing period
- Lockers available to all $6^{\text {th }}$ grade students
- Core classes
- Math, Science, English, Reading \& Social Studies
- Non-core classes
- Elective, PE



## Differences between Elementary \& Junior High <br> - MORE FREEDOM!!

- Cafeteria - Multiple options
- Different lunch lines that offer snack bar options, hot lunch, etc
- You can sit wherever you want at lunch
- Many Clubs \& Activities
- The opportunity to make a lot of new friends
- Tardies!!: Students need to get to class on time every period
- Expect more homework, responsibilities, \& self management
- Attend tutorials
- Canvas is used in all courses
- Student IDs/lanyards must be worn at all times


## Differences between

 Elementary \& Junior HighBackpacks are allowed to be carried to each class. Rolling backpacks are not allowed.

Technology allowed during lunch and it is the responsibility of each student. Technology use in the classroom is at teacher discretion. Misuse of technology can lead to revocation of technology privileges at school.
Students go between classes, to the restroom, lunch, and PE by themselves, not escorted by teachers.
Student planner/tracker -highly recommend to organize classwork and homework for your 7 classes.

## Choosing Courses

## Three Class Format:

Academic - For everyone, on grade level, more time to review concepts, prepares students for college as well as other postsecondary education

KAP - More challenging, fast paced, prepares students for AP classes in high school. *We recommend students have an " $A$ " average in an Academic class

GT - Must be currently screened and identified

## Choosing Courses

The decision to take academic or KAP should be made between you, your parents, and your teachers. Think about:

- Your interests and strengths
- How hard you are willing to work
- The grades you have ear ned in school and the kind of grades you like to make
- Motivation and attitude
- Standar dized test scores
- Study habits
- Extracurricular activities and time commitments
- How quickly you catch on to new mater ial


## KAP PROGRAM INFORMATION

- Although we highly encourage students to stay in a KAP class, they may exit a course during the first 6 -weeks grading period or at the end of the $1{ }^{\text {st }}$ semester.
- The student must have teacher and parent approval to exit.
- If the student's 6 -weeks average falls below 70, the student will be placed into an Academic class at the end of the grading period unless otherwise recommended by the teacher.

The KAP Course Commitment form is included on the back of the course selection sheet.

## Math for 6 th Graders

$6^{\text {th }}, 7^{\text {th }}$, and $8^{\text {th }}$ grade math classes are the foundations for high school math classes and should not be rushed.

Academic Math - on grade level curriculum

* Students will have math homework weekly to practice the concepts
* Students will learn $6^{\text {th }}$ grade math skills/concepts only
* There are approximately 64 objectives covered

KAP Math - accelerated math class covering all of $6^{\text {th }}$ grade and approximately $1 / 2$ of $7^{\text {th }}$ grade math curriculum

* A new concept is learned almost every day
* Students will have math homework every night to practice the concepts
* KAP math focuses on preparing students for High School Algebra I in $8^{\text {th }}$ grade
* There are approximately over 80 objectives ( $1 / 2$ of them are $7^{\text {th }}$ grade)
* Students who earn "Masters" on $4^{\text {th }}$ grade STAAR are automatically placed in $6{ }^{\text {th }}$ Math KAP
* $6^{\text {th }}$ grade KAP Math Students will take the $6^{\text {th }}$ grade STAAR
* Current high achieving students in $5^{\text {th }}$ grade math can take a Credit By Exam (CBE) for $6^{\text {th }}$ grade Math this summer (June/July testing windows). Students who pass the $6^{\text {th }}$ grade Math CBE will be eligible to take $7^{\text {th }}$ grade KAP Math in $6^{\text {th }}$ grade.


## Characteristics of a KAP Math Student

* Problem solver in everyday situations
* Has developed strong learning \& study habits
* Shows perseverance when challenged
* Displays emotional maturity when frustrated
* Demonstrates reasoning skills pertaining to mathematical concepts in everyday life
* Shows confidence in their own math abilities
* Strong/mastered fast facts skills
* Willingness to ask questions in class and seek out help
* Strongly values learning - loves to learn!



## KAP Math for $6^{\text {th }}-8^{\text {th }}$ Grade

KAP is the compacting of the junior high curriculum from 3 years to 2 years so that your child would be able to take Algebra I (a high school credit class) by $8^{\text {th }}$ grade.

By taking your first high school math class in junior high, this frees up your child's senior year, to choose to take AP calculus, AP statistics, or other dual credit college credit math classes.

## ELAR, Science, and Social Studies

* The difference in academic and KAP for English Language Arts \& Reading (ELA-R), Science, and Social Studies comes in the resources/materials used and performance expectations.
* KAP is built upon the core academic curriculum and is designed to build student capacity to understand more rigorous content.
* KAP is designed to help prepare students for advanced courses in high school.
*ELA-R is blocked meaning it is 2 class periods in a row with the same teacher.


## Masters Level on STAAR

- If a student scores "Masters" on their $4^{\text {th }}$ grade STAAR in Math or Reading, they will automatically be put into the correlating KAP course.
- In SchooLinks the KAp course will be preloaded for these students.
- If you would like to opt-out of the automatic placement, you have the option to change the course to Academic during the course selection window in SchooLinks.
- There will also be opt-out information coming for those who would be automatically moved into KAP courses.

These courses take the place of your elective class.

* Math Lab: designed to help refine math concepts and fill in gaps


## Possible Required Courses



* Strategic Reading: designed to help improve reading proficiency and comprehension

Placement may be mandatory as a result of KISD standards and graduation requirements.

STAAR results are used to determine placement in the above courses.

- $6^{\text {th }}$ grade is allowed to choose 1 elective for the year.
- Please be aware that some electives require after school commitments.
- Electives have assignments \& receive numeric grades.
- $6^{\text {th }}$ grade electives:
- Art, Band, Choir, Orchestra, Theatre, and Lead Worthy Intermediate
- Due to the high demand of certain electives, placement in elective courses will be limited based on availability and is not guaranteed.

- How much time outside of school is needed to participate/practice in the elective class
- What do you like to do for fun
- What outside time constraints do you have?

## LEADWORTHY INTERMEDNATE (BTHI)

- This is a NEW elective next year
- Offered only to 6th graders
- Focuses on becoming independently responsible through time-management and organization
- Works through nine character traits to grow the leadership skills of students
- Builds a positive school culture that inspires and empowers students to lead with heart
- P.E.

All students will be enrolled in a Physical Education class
$\square$ Both boys and girls (separate gyms)
Graded class/attend everyday
Dress out in uniforms: bring your own athletic shoes \& socks

Lockers in locker room
Students will pay a $\$ 15$ fee at the beginning of the year for their PE uniform, locker, and
laundry service.
$\square$ Off Campus P.E.
$\square$ Off Campus P.E. forms will not be accepted until August 1, 2024 through the first week of school in the front office

If you participate in an approved individual sport for less than 15 hours per week, you will receive Study Hall as your replacement class
$\square$ If you participate in an approved individual sport for 15 or more hours a week you may leave campus after $7^{\text {th }}$ period. These students will sign themselves out daily at the attendance window

## Athletics

## Only for $7^{\text {th }} \& 8^{\text {th }}$ graders - this is just so you know what's coming in the future!!

* Based on tryouts at the end of your $6^{\text {th }}$ and $7^{\text {th }}$ grade school year
* Coaches determine placement into athletics
* Must have physical on file dated after May 1, 2023 \& RankOne online forms completed
- Athletic period (Fall) sports:
- Football
- Volleyball
- Basketball
* After school (Spring) sports not placed in the athletic period:
* Track
* Soccer
- Tennis
* Pre-Athletics will take place during your $6^{\text {th }}$ grade year through your PE Class

Please see the coach if you are interested in playing a sport in $7^{\text {th }}$ or $8^{\text {th }}$ grade
Coaches will give the counselors a list of students to be scheduled into the athletic period later this semester

## course Requests Overview

- Course Selection Planning sheets go home with all $5^{\text {th }}$ graders on Monday, January $29^{\text {th }}$
- Students make course selections in SchooLinks (students login through your myKaty Cloud login) on February $5^{\text {th }}$ February $19^{\text {th }}$
- Course Selection Planning sheets must be turned in to your $5^{\text {th }}$ grade teacher by February 7, 2024
- If you are moving or planning to move, you still must complete a course selection sheet
- Both the student and parent must sign the course sheet
- If you are signing up for KAP classes, both the student and parent must read the KAP commitment letter on the back of the course selection sheet
- Return Signed Course Selection Planning Sheets to your homeroom teacher by February $7^{\text {th }}$
- All students must sign up for the following courses:
- English
- Math
- Science
- Social Studies
- PE
- Elective \& alternate elective choices

## Course Selections

- The district is using a college and career platform called SchooLinks. Students will use SchooLinks for the course selection process. Your child can access SchooLinks through mykaty Cloud.

- Elementary counselors will meet with each student to help with the course selection process
- Course verification window is March 18-26 and will take place in SchooLinks
- The courses listed in SchooLinks is not a schedule - it is only the list of courses you selected
- This is your last opportunity to make changes
- More information on the course verification process will come as we get closer to March
