smallest assignment to the greatest challenge.



It was not to be tutoring or academically based, just a caring mentor who wanted to share a life journey with a child. Back then we had no idea of the impact this program would have not just on the lives of our KEYS kids, but also in the lives of our mentors. There are countless stories of how one mentor with one student for one hour per week has radically changed lives and uplifted futures.

While most of our programs are more visible, KEYS quietly makes a profound impact on the students who are blessed with a mentor.

Our KEYS mentors rise up – one hour per week, during the school day, for one school year – to meet their student. The KEYS mentor program is a commitment unlike any other, with the potential to significantly alter the course of

both a student's and a mentor's life. Mentors have the opportunity to make a lasting impact on a student, while students benefit immensely from the guidance, support, and wisdom imparted by their mentors. This mutual exchange of knowledge, encouragement, and mentorship can be truly transformative.

Being a mentor is a serious commitment, but with serious commitments come serious rewards. On many of our campuses, KEYS is the chosen method of intervention to help and support a student who just needs that one special someone in their life.


Simply put, mentors rise up to help children realize who they are and who they can become.






