Who Are WATCH D.O.G.S.?

To become a WATCH D.O.G. follow these simple steps:

- Step 1 Register as a volunteer for Katy ISD: https://www.katyisd.org/Page/7769
- Step 2 Go to the 2024-2025 MPE Watch D.O.G.S. sign-up by visiting this URL https://docs.google.com/forms/d/1xV2FFzSoEl4lwxECLyYTburYRfNpDDin uty5NwosUdA/edit
- Step 3 Please consider buying an official Watch D.O.G.S. shirt to wear during your visit. Shirts can be purchased from MPE for \$10 cash only (exact change only). MPE has a few of the short-sleeved white T-Shirt design for purchase. Shirts can also be purchased directly from Watch D.O.G.S. online store.
 - o **NOTE** If you are ordering from Watch D.O.G.S. directly, please ensure you have your shirt delivered in time. It is highly recommended that you wear your Watch D.O.G.S. t-shirt or shirt during your visit at MPE.
- **Step 4** Ensure you bring your valid, state issued photo ID for sign-in to the Main Office the morning you arrive. There you will be granted a white Raptor badge; the badge must be worn on your shirt in a highly visible location.

What Does a Typical WATCH D.O.G.S. Day Look Like at MPE?

The responsibilities depend on the day itself, as responsibilities and priorities change day-to-day, and sometimes minute-to-minute. With that said, flexibility and adaptability are key. But a typical day, might look like this:

7:30 - Sign-in at Front Office

7:35 - 7:50 - Arrival car-rider duty

7:50 - 8:00 - Morning Announcements

8:10 – 10:30 – Support Front Office, Library, Specials Classes, Classrooms

10:30 - 12:30 - Cafeteria Duty

12:30-1:00 - Lunch

1:00 - 2:45 - Support Front Office, Library, Specials Classes, Classrooms

2:45 - 3:20 - Dismissal car-rider duty

3:20 - 3:30 – Report to the Front Office to pick up your child and sign-out



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What Do WATCH D.O.G.S. do at MPE?

- Assisting with arrival duty
- Assisting with dismissal duty
- Assisting the custodial crew
- Assisting in the lunchroom
- Assisting the front office staff

- Walk the campus (inside and outside) to make sure we're safe and secure
