- Membership in Student Council for all the years that service was performed
- Submit a resume with your name, address, and student ID number that lists your extracurricular activities within the school, community, work, and any leadership roles and awards
- Submit a copy of your service transcript from www.x2VOL.com
- Submit a typed response to the SOS Scholarship essay question
- Submit the short reflection questions
- Write your student ID number in the lower right-hand corner on each page of your application
