KAP PROGRAM INFORMATION

- STUDENTS MAY EXIT A KAP COURSE DURING THE FIRST 6-WEEKS GRADING PERIOD OR AT THE END OF THE 1ST SEMESTER.

HIGH SCHOOL GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

- LOTE – 2 CREDITS (**SPANISH 1/SSP1 & 2**)
- FINE ARTS – 1 CREDIT (**HS ART 1**)
- PE – 1 CREDIT
- HEALTH – 0.5 CREDIT
- COMMUNICATION – 0.5 CREDIT
- OTHER ELECTIVES – 6 CREDITS (**PRIN. OF: HUMAN SERVICES, MANUFACTURING, ENGINEERING, ETC.**)

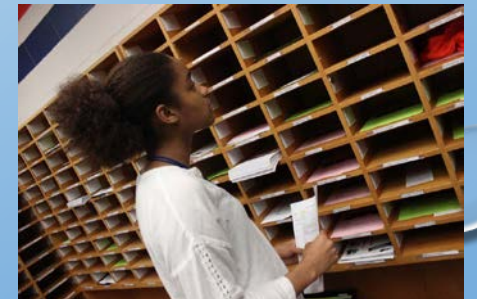

PRINCIPLES OF INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY



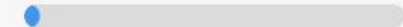
