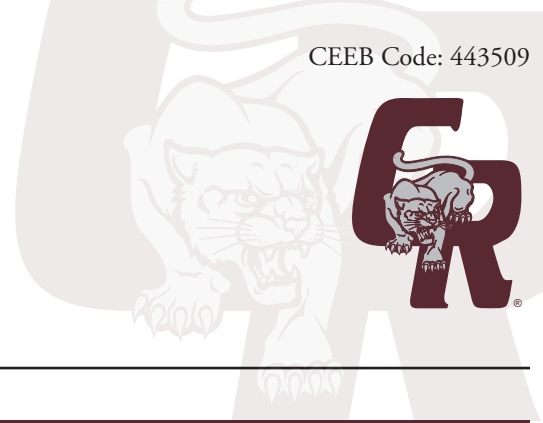

THE COMMUNITY

Cinco Ranch High School, Katy ISD's fourth high school, was established in 1999. The school, located twenty-three miles west of Houston, is expansive not only in size, but also in its dedication to excellence and its commitment to the success of its students, faculty and staff. Because of its already excellent educational reputation, CRHS attracts families from all over the world. Success is not measured in educational terms alone. Students and staff are respected, valued, and held to the highest standards of personal responsibility and integrity. CRHS has the mission of providing a challenging education and promoting leadership to a highly talented and diverse student population. Cinco Ranch High School works to ensure success by enabling students to become responsible citizens, leaders, and individuals who have a passion to continue their learning throughout life.

SCHOOL FACTS

Cinco Ranch High School is a public four-year secondary school with an enrollment of 3,793 students in grades nine through twelve. The Class of 2023 had 829 students. The teaching faculty is composed of 205 dedicated professionals. CRHS has earned an A rating from TEA. The school is also a member of CEEB, NACAC, TACAC, and TASSP. In 2008, Cinco Ranch High School was named National Blue Ribbon School as a result of its students scoring in the top 10% in the state of Texas and has earned top 10 honors in athletic and academic programs in Texas. The school day consists of seven class periods which meet five days a week. Each class period is approximately 50 minutes in length. The school year is divided into two semesters with three six-week marking periods in each semester.

CLASS RANK

KISD uses a weighted 4.0 grading scale. Class Rank is based on a cumulative grade point average for grades 9-12, plus high school courses taken in junior high and credits earned via preapproved Katy ISD provider(s). Students are officially ranked for the first time after the fifth semester in high school. Katy ISD only ranks the top 10% of the senior class. Quartile will only be populated on transcripts for students who are in the 1st, 2nd or 3rd quartile. Quartile will not show for students in the 4th quartile or students new to Katy ISD. A full year, one period course consisting of two semesters is equivalent to one credit.

KISD GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

Students must earn a passing score on five STAAR/EOC state assessments (English I, English II, Algebra I, Biology, & US History). In addition to earning all required course credits for their graduation plan to earn a diploma, Katy ISD students must also satisfy the following academic requirements:

STEM, Business & Industry, Public Services, Arts & Humanities, Multidisciplinary Studies, and Distinguished Level of Achievement.

DISTINGUISHED LEVEL OF ACHIEVEMENT

A student may earn a distinguished level of achievement by successfully completing all curriculum requirements for the Foundation High School Program, plus each of the following:

- A fourth credit in mathematics, which must include Algebra II;
- A fourth credit in science;
- The requirements of at least one endorsement.

A student must graduate with a Distinguished Level of Achievement to be considered for the Top 10% and eligible for automatic admission to a Texas public college or university.

PERFORMANCE ACKNOWLEDGEMENTS

A student may earn a performance acknowledgement in one or more of the following categories:

- AP test score of 3 or above;
- IB test score of 4 or above (applies to transfer students only as the International Baccalaureate program is not offered in Katy ISD);
- Outstanding performance on the PSAT, SAT or ACT;
- Completion of at least 12 hours college coursework with final grades of A or B (3.0 GPA or above);
- Bilingualism and biliteracy; and
- Earning a state, nationally or internationally recognized business or industry certification or license.
