## OLE WILL:

- Provide high-quality instruction of standards-based curriculum for each child and taught by highly qualified teachers.
- Communicate with parents clearly and consistently, providing specific ideas to assist at home. Parent-teacher conferences will be held near the beginning of the school year, and throughout the year whenever a need arises. Teachers have a designated time each day for planning and parent communication.
- Provide a safe and positive environment for all stakeholders.
- Encourage volunteer efforts from parents by providing specific opportunities throughout the year.
- Provide parents frequent reports on their children's progress. (Progress reports every 4 weeks and report cards every 9 weeks; student work and communication flyers sent in take-home folders; use of student planners in grades 3rd through 5th.)
- Hold 2 in-school Title I parent events and invite parents to 1 District-level parent meeting each year.
- Conduct a survey each year to determine needs of parents and students, using results to revise our programs and parent family engagement policy, as needed.

## PARENTS WILL:

- Send their children to school on a daily and timely basis and ensure they are fed, rested and ready to learn.
- Make sure homework is completed and returned.
- Monitor the amount of screen time, social media, and television their children watch and make sure the content is child-appropriate.
- Volunteer at the school, whenever possible.
- Stay informed about their children's education and communicate with the school frequently in a helpful, supportive manner.
