
- Projects assigned and completed in class under the direction of the classroom teacher may be weighted as a major grade.

- Teachers should record a <u>minimum of 2 grades</u> in each reporting category <u>per grading</u> <u>period (9 weeks)</u>, with at least one major grade recorded prior to the interim progress report.
- By the end of each grading period, 10-14 grades should be recorded in RLA, Social Studies, Math, and Science.


















Frequently Asked Questions (FAQ)

Q: What is the cell phone policy/allowance?

A: Changes have been made since going 1:1 with Chromebooks. Updates will be made to Student Handbook and Discipline Plan. Please refer to the most updated Student handbook for clarification.

Q: How can parents access textbooks?

A: Textbooks are online and accessed through your child's My Katy Cloud account.

Q: My (6th grade) child passed the 6th KAP Math CBE. What class will they be in?

A: If they are a GT student, they will be in **7th** KAP/GT Math. If they are a KAP student, they will be in **7th** grade KAP Math.

Q: If KAP doesn't require an assessment to get in (open enrollment), how is that different than KAP/GT?

A: GT services are provided in specific sections of KAP taught by a GT certified teacher and with a cluster of GT identified students. Teachers provide differentiated instruction and projects for the GT students. Some ELA courses, like 7th GT ELA, are pure GT classes.

Q: What did my child learn while I was in this presentation?

A: Your child rotated through three classes: time management/organization, Amazing Race: An intro to JH (trivia, facts about campuses, etc), and an interest inventory that we connected to clubs/electives. The goal is to give them an overview of JH and get them excited about the opportunities they will have as JH students.

Q: What does a typical day in 6th grade look like?

A: There are 8 class periods (ELA (2-period block), math, science, social studies, PE, elective, advisory) plus lunch. Class periods are about 45 min each (ELA is about 90 min). It's a long day with a lot of movement.

Q: Is there a class period like study hall that students can use to do work?

A: Different campuses use <u>advisory</u> for different purposes. Some use it for additional classroom instruction/practice. Other campuses use it like a study hall/homework period. You will find out in August how your campus uses the advisory period and what your child's options are.

Q: Will we know our child's (class) assignments ahead of time so we can help them prepare?

A: Yes! Please <u>check Canvas daily</u> so you are aware of all of your child's assignments. It is especially important that students complete test reviews to prepare for their tests.

Q: What is the process of moving from GT to KAP?

A: Students do not move from GT to KAP, as the curriculum/objectives are the same (exception: 7th ELA you can move from GT to KAP because the 7th GT ELA class is compacted and 7th KAP ELA is not). If a child is not successful in an (advanced) KAP/GT or KAP class, then they would move to an ACA (on level) class. This can be done at any time by parent request (contact counselor). It may be initiated by the teacher and/or GT Facilitator is the child fails one or more grading periods.

Q: What will happen if they fail KAP? Will they be promoted to the next grade level?

A: KAP students who fail a grading period (<70) will be moved to an academic class. A GT student who fails (<70) a grading period in a KAP/GT class will be put on a GT Growth plan and work with their GT Facilitator (for the next grading period). If they are unable to show growth, they will exit GT services in that area and be moved to an ACA class.

Q: Can they start earning HS credit in 6th grade?

A: No. There are no HS credit classes offered to 6th graders.

Q: How do JH teachers handle missed days? Can students get work ahead of time?

A: No. Work is made up once the student returns to school. Arrangements will be made (before/after school/advisory) to make up missed tests/quizzes.

Q: Do you recommend that a student take all KAP classes in 6th grade?

A: JH is a low-risk environment to try (KAP) advanced classes. JH courses are not calculated into GPA. I encourage your child to try as many KAP classes as they are interested in.

Q: Can I add more KAP classes to my child's schedule before school begins?

A: Yes! Please reach out to the counselor in August with your request.

Q: Does my child need a phone in JH?

A: No. Phones will not be permitted in classes. Please refer to the 2024-2025 Student Handbook and Discipline Management Plan for the most updated policy.

Q: How do we get feedback on assignments/graded work?

A: Check Canvas, Aware, Google Forms, etc to see your child's score on different work. In Aware, you can see missed questions on tests/quizzes (for a limited time, once the teacher opens the assignment).

Q: Is there a list of club programs available at each campus?

A: Each campus will have a list of the clubs offered. Reach out to your campus for that information.

Q: Is there an option for parent/teachers meetings?

A: Reach out to the teacher if you have things to discuss. They will communicate through email and arrange a phone call or F2F meeting if needed.

Q: How soon/often are grades/missing assignments posted in HAC?

A: <u>23-24 Secondary Grading Handbook</u> states: "Teachers will post grades within 5 days for most assignments." Please refer to updated 24-25 Grading Handbook for current information. Reach out to teachers if you have questions about the grading policy.

Q: In a grading period, how many days before progress report (IPR) or report card (RC) does the teacher have to submit grades?

A: Teachers submit IPR and RC grades 2-3 days before they are viewable to parents.

Q: Are tutorials available?

A: Yes! All teachers are required to provide FREE tutorials before or after school. Your child's teachers will let you know their tutorials schedules.

Q: My child had NO homework in 5th grade. Are 6th grade teachers aware of this?

A: I'm not sure. This is something you can bring up with admin (at both schools), but expect your child to have homework in JH.

Q: Can a child move from ACA to KAP classes?

A: Yes! KAP classes are open enrollment. You can make that change next year when filling out course selection. Some schools allow students to move from ACA to KAP during the school year. Reach out to your campus for more information.

Q: Is the Gradeway App only for kids, or for parents as well? Can we see grades for multiple kids?

A: Yes, <u>Gradeway</u> is for parents and students. Parents can see multiple kids on one device. See app information for details.

Q: My kids are in club and select level sports. How much homework is to be expected daily/weekly?

A: Each teacher determines the homework load for their class. Reach out to your teachers/campus with questions/concerns.

Q: Is it hard to move your child from KAP to ACA? I've heard it's frowned upon.

A: We want all kids to have the opportunity to try an advanced curriculum. A low "A", a "B", or even high "C" is not a good reason to move to ACA. It's about finding the right pace of learning for your child, even if they aren't getting an A. Productive struggle can be a powerful learning experience.

Q: Do classes have a syllabus?

A: No. You will not get a semester or year syllabus like you would with a college course. Teachers post assignments and due dates on Canvas, typically 1 week (sometimes 1 unit) at a time.

Q: Are assignments graded on a Bell curve?

A: No. Students receive the grade that they earn based on the number of questions completed and answered correctly or the adherence to a project rubric.

Q: Can I sync Canvas calendar with my Google/Apple calendar?

A: Yes!

Q: Does JH offer summer school classes?

A: No. Summer courses are only for kids who failed a course during the year, or for English Language Learners.

Q: How do supply lists given fit into helping our children stay organized?

A: Schools create supply lists for their specific needs. Any organizational system for your child can be customized using supplies from the list.

Q: What if a child takes Algebra 1 in 8th grade but doesn't want KAP classes in HS?

A: They can select ACA Geometry for 9th grade. They are not required to continue to take KAP level classes. They can switch to ACA classes at any time.

Q: What is the difference between weighted and unweighted GPA?

A: Weighted GPA includes all classes graded on a 4-point scale and a 5-point scale. Unweighted GPA grades counts all classes on a 4-point scale.

Q: Is a "B" in a KAP class weighted the same as an "A" in an academics class in HS?

A: Yes. for HS credit classes, KAP and AP courses are graded on a 5-point scale. Dual Credit is graded on a 4.5 scale. Academic classes are graded on a 4-point scale.

Q: For Dual Credit (DC) classes, do students still have to take a test to get credit?

A: There is a not an exam for credit, like an AP class. DC classes are community college classes taught at the HS. You pay the cost of the community college class and complete all the course work to receive credit.

Q: Do you have to take KAP classes to be eligible for AP courses?

A: No. KAP and AP courses are open enrollment (as long as all prerequisites are met). However, KAP classes are designed to prepare students for success in AP classes (higher rigor).

Q: Do you have to pay, take, and pass an AP test to get (college) credit?

A: Yes. There is not a fee to take an AP course in HS. However, to earn college credit, you must <u>pay to take the exam</u> and meet the required minimum score for colleges to accept it as credit. Students can take an AP class and choose not to take the AP exam. They will receive HS credit for the class, but will not get any college credits.

Q: Does a score on an AP exam affect GPA?

A: No. The child's grade in the course is calculated into their GPA. The AP exam score determines whether or not the student will receive college credit for the course.

Q: Do you continue taking a subject once you pass the AP exam (ex: history)?

A: There are many different courses in each content area (ex: AP <u>US</u> History, AP <u>World</u> History, etc). Your HS counselor can help you navigate how many credits are required for graduation in each content and what AP courses are available.

Q: What is Dual Credit (DC)?

A: High School Dual Credit (DC) courses are available for a fee. They are Community College (CC) courses that are taught at the HS by a CC/HS certified teacher. The child passes the class and receives both HS and CC credit for it.

Q: Which is better, AP or DC?

A: Depends on your goals. AP exam credits are accepted at most Universities as college credit (either content or elective). DC is a great option if you are planning to go to an in-state University. DC gives you Community College (CC) credits that are typically more easily transferable to in-state schools than to out-of-state Universities. Please contact your HS counselor for more information.
