What's the difference?

Dual Credit	Advanced Placement (AP)
Curriculum designed by HCC, Course may be taught by a Katy ISD teacher or HCC professor	Curriculum designed by College Board, Course taught by a Katy ISD teacher
College credit dependent upon a passing grade in the course	College credit depending upon passing the AP exam*
GPA on 4.5 scale	GPA on 5.0 scale
Generally transferable to colleges/universities in Texas	Credit policy varies by college/university AP Credit Policy
Cost: \$65 plus books, other materials HCC reserves the right to change the cost of a course.	Cost: Exam fee \$102** *credit varies based on college/university policy **assistance available for students on free/reduced lunch

- The ability for students to experience a college class while in a supportive home/school environment
- Development of college-level analytical and study skills
- The opportunity for students to build academic confidence



Benefits of Dual Credit

Cost Savings:

Cost at HCC: \$550/3-hour course plus fees and textbooks

Cost in Katy ISD: \$65/course plus textbook (2023-2023 school year) *HCC reserves the right to change the cost of tuition.

Save Time:

Earning college credit while in high school means less time (and money) spent at a college or university after graduation.

Weighted GPA:

A=4.5 B=3.5 C=2.5

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Important Updates

Students *new* to Dual Credit will need to submit two things to HCC:

- Waiver form -The waiver allows HCC to apply a DC tuition waiver to the students' account.
- The Residency form This form allows HCC to edit student information in the event it was entered incorrectly in ApplyTexas

Returning students do not need to submit anything EXCEPT the CAMPUS' ONLINE REGISTRATION

FERPA Release: Easier to submit it online since it has to be taken to HCC. https://formsportal.hccs.edu/Forms/FERPA

Bacterial Meningitis: Required for students who attend a class at HCC. Vaccine information may be submitted to the email address on the form, or students may complete the waiver linked on the form if they choose not to get the vaccine.





UIL Eligibility-No Pass, No Play

For High School Students there are courses that are exempt from the rule below.

A student may not participate in any extracurricular activity if a grade lower than 70 is earned in any class at the end of the six-week reporting period. This student may continue to participate in all practices and preparations as determined necessary by the coach, director, or sponsor of the organization during this time of ineligibility. This student may regain full eligibility status to participate in the extracurricular activity if, at the end of the designated 3 week period, all grades in all classes are equal or greater than 70.

Exception: Advanced high school courses identified by the Texas Education Agency are exempted from this policy. There are no class/course exceptions to this No-Pass; No-Play guideline for students in grades 6-8.

•Dual Credit courses in English, LOTE, Math, Science, and Social Studies only.

TSI Writing Test

A 300-600 word essay.

TSI Math Test

- There are 20-68 multiple-choice questions on this test.
- · Subject matter includes:
 - Quantitative Reasoning, Algebraic Reasoning, Geometric and Spatial Reasoning and Probabilistic and Statistical Reasoning.



Student Registration

ApplyTexas Application

- applytexas.org
- ☐ Typically takes 24-48 hours for students to get HCC information after applying
- Students who are returning DO NOT have to apply using ApplyTexas again. They already have their needed information.
- Paperwork is required for new HCC students only.
- Reminder: If student is enrolling in a summer DCC course, they do not need to complete a separate ApplyTexas application.



Typical Issues with Apply Texas

- 1. Students does not fully apply. Student does not press "submit."
- 2. Student applies to the college they plan to attend instead of Houston Community College as a Dual Credit Student.
- 3. Student selects the wrong term. (Spring instead of fall)



Payment Deadlines

Summer I: June 15, 2024

Summer II: July 15, 2024

Fall 2024: October 1, 2024*

*Payment may not be available on the MyEagle account until September 2024 for the fall semester.



HCC does not differentiate between unexcused and excused absences.

- 1. KISD field trips count as absences.
- 2. Student can be dropped for excessive absences (more than 6).
- 3. Student is responsible for make-up work.
- 4. Specific Meetings times and days vary by campus.

What are AP Classes?

- AP classes are college-level courses offered in high school
 - Courses reflect what is taught in top introductory college courses
- Students take AP Exams at the end of the course, measuring their mastery of college-level work
 - A score of 3 or higher on an AP Exam will earn students college credit and/or placement into advanced courses at all Texas public universities and colleges.



What is it like to take AP Classes?

- AP classes are for any students who are academically prepared and motivated to take college-level courses.
 - AP classes are full of interesting course material and great discussions
 - It's no secret that AP classes are challenging. But the support you receive from your classmates and teachers can help you manage the workload.
 - AP Teachers in Katy ISD support their students and help them succeed
