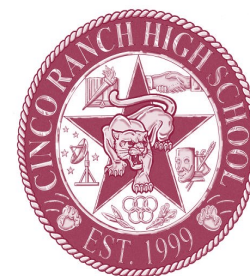

Cinco Ranch High School, Katy ISD’s fourth high school, was established in 1999. Because of its already excellent educational reputation, Cinco Ranch High School attracts families from all over the world.

Even though Cinco Ranch High School is a highly academically competitive school, success is not measured in educational terms alone. Students and staff are respected, valued, and held to the highest standards of personal responsibility and integrity. Cinco Ranch High School has the mission of providing a challenging education and promoting leadership to a highly talented and diverse student population. Cinco Ranch High School works to ensure success by enabling students to become responsible citizens, leaders, and individuals who have a passion to continue their learning throughout life.

School Facts

Cinco Ranch High School is a public four-year secondary school with an enrollment of 3,497 in grades nine through twelve. The Class of 2022 has 820 students. The teaching faculty is composed of 205 dedicated professionals.

Cinco Ranch High School earned an A rating from TEA. The school is also a member of CEEB, NACAC, TACAC, and TASSP. Cinco Ranch High School was named a National Blue Ribbon School as a result of its students scoring in the top 10% in the state of Texas on state tests. U.S. News and World Report named Cinco Ranch High School among the top high schools in the nation. The Niche Organization also ranked Cinco Ranch High School #7 in the greater Houston area and #19 in the state. Four different years Cinco Ranch has earned top 10 honors in the UIL Lone Star Cup, which recognizes the best overall athletic and academic programs in Texas. Cinco Ranch High School was on the Educational Results Partnership Honor Roll for 2017-2018 and 2018-2019.

The school day consists of seven class periods which meet five days a week. Each class period is approximately 50 minutes in length. The school year is divided into two semesters with three six-week marking periods in each semester.
