Needs Assessment Overview Summary

Historical data: OKE earned ELA/READING, MATH, SCIENCE, POSTSECONDARY READINESS, and COMPARATIVE CLOSING THE GAPS Distinction Designations for 2019. Domain II School Progress Part B- Relative Performance continues to be an area needing improvement. We scored an 85 for 2019 and an 84 for 2018.

We were one (1) point from from earning a Distinction Designation in Comparative Academic Growth. We earned a 91 and needed a 92 in order to earn this, therefore, scoring a B on our rating in this category.

Due to COVID 19, STAAR was not administered in Spring 2020, therefore we do not have 2019-2020 STAAR scores to compare. 2021 Domain I- Student Domain II- Relative Performance scores was a 74. Will continue this goal for 2023-2024.

21-22 OKE earned MATH, SCIENCE, POSTSECONDARY READINESS, and COMPARATIVE CLOSING THE GAPS Distinction Designations. Domain II School Progress Part B- Relative Performance Scale Score 90 and Letter A.

Demographics Summary

Odessa Kilpatrick Elementary opened in 2003. OKE serves approximately 1,100 students in grades PreK- 5th. PreK, K, and 1st grade classrooms are self-contained. 2nd-5th is departmentalized between Math/Science and ELA. OKE has a population of 20.1% economically disadvantaged, 39.5 % English Language Learners (ELL), 7.8% mobility rate, 17.7% Special Education, and an average daily attendance rate of 96.33%. Our teachers are 100% highly qualified. OKE will continue to recruit highly qualified teachers.
