Dear Parent/Guardian:

Today your child was informed about the importance of high school credit courses taken in junior high. The high school credit courses offered at Beck Junior High are challenging and offer our students an opportunity to get a glimpse of what high school courses entail. All high school credit courses offered at Beck Junior High allow students the opportunity to earn grade points which are recorded on their high school transcript and count toward the student's high school grade point average (GPA) and ranking. Beginning with the Class of 2029, junior high Algebra 1 will not factor into the student's GPA (Grade Point Average) if the student successfully completes 4 additional credits of high school math. A transcript is a record of all the grades earned in high school credit classes taken by a student. Transcripts are used to apply for colleges or jobs in the workforce after graduation from high school. In high school credit courses, grades are recorded in semesters and not by six weeks and credit is given if a student earns a grade of 70 or higher each semester. A student cannot earn duplicate credit for a course taken previously.

Grade points earned based on semester grades are as follows:

COURSE	90-100 A	80-89 B	70-79 C	69 and below F
Advanced	5	4	3	0
Academic	4	3	2	0

To support your student's success, we ask that parents ensure that all assignments are completed and turned in, monitor attendance, and maintain an open line of communication with your child's teacher.

The last day to request a drop from a high school credit course is August 27, 2024.

Students who earn an "F" at the end of the first or second grading period in a high school credit course will be removed from the course. During the first semester, **no course changes will be made after the second grading period**. Students who earn a first semester failing grade will have the grade recorded on their transcript and will be removed from the course for the second semester. Students will not be removed from the course during the second semester.
